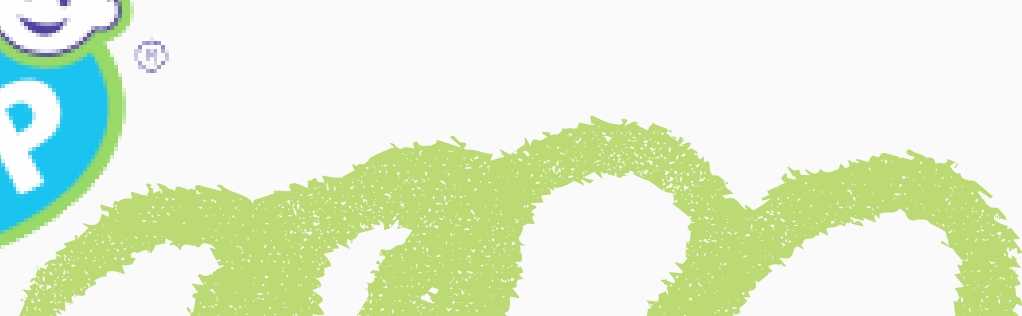

39 DRAWING STARTERS

Sometimes kids can use a little inspiration to get them started on an art project. These 39 drawing prompts are all different and can get kids creative juices flowing

Use these during downtime or as the beginning of an art class.



LEARNING FROM DRAWING

1. Holding and drawing with a crayon, pencil, marker, pen, or paintbrush is critical to the fine motor skill and hand-eye coordination needed for writing.
2. Art allows a child to express themselves. A picture is worth a thousand words – especially to a child who doesn't have the same mastery of language that adults do. Try watching them create, without commenting, and then talk to them afterwards about what they drew, and why. Talking to your kids about their drawings can be an incredible way to get them to open up to you, and you can learn more about how they think and what they care about.
3. Art encourages creativity. For a little more fun with this activity, and to really encourage creativity, have them pick one prompt, and then challenge them to come up with 10 unique pictures for the same prompt.
4. Drawing can teach perseverance. Try giving kids a new prompt each month, and then put them all together in order at the end of the year. You and your child will be impressed by the obvious growth they'll see.
