

30 BINGO BOARDS + 137 CALLING CARDS






FOOTBALL BINGO

Football Bingo is a great way to help kids learn through play. It's fun, it helps with spelling and sportsmanship, and it might reach some kids who love sports or who don't learn as well from more traditional worksheets.


You can print these each time you need them or laminate them to re-use them.

You can use it as a full class activity or in centers.



WHAT'S INCLUDED

- 30 unique 1/2 sheet bingo boards with football-related pictures, numbers, and letters on each board
- Black and white versions of all the boards
- A4 (international) version of all the color and black and white boards
- 137 (1" x 1.2") calling cards
- Instructions for assembly
- Ideas for how to play and learn



HOW TO ASSEMBLE & PLAY

- 1. Print the 30 boards and the cards in the size you prefer
- 2. Laminate all the pages (optional)
- 3. Cut the 15 pages of Bingo boards in half to create 30 boards
- 4. Cut apart the 137 calling cards and store them in a Ziploc bag
- 5. Hand out the Bingo boards and dry erase markers or physical markers
- 6. Choose a random calling card from the Ziploc bag.
- 7. Call out the item on the card
- 8. Kids will check if it's on their board.
- 9.If you've laminated the Bingo boards, they can mark it off with a dry erase marker
- 10. If you haven't laminated the Bingo boards, kids can use markers like small blocks, pennies, cheerios, or scraps of paper
- 11. The first kid to get five in a row horizontally, vertically, or diagonally, wins the game

LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

- 1. Letter & Number recognition: All of the boards contain individual letters and numbers to help kids learn to recognize them
- 2. Spelling: Any time kids interact with a picture and the word underneath it, it will help them internalize the correct spelling of the word. You can increase this learning by having kids spell the words out loud, or, when a single letter is called, have them come up with a word that starts with that letter.
- 3. Sportsmanship/Working Together: Any time kids play games together they will work on their sportsmanship. You can increase this learning by having kids take turns calling out the items on the calling cards or by having them play independently in small groups.
- 4. You can use The Trip Clip website to customize these boards. You might want to include only capital letters or single digit numbers. You could also include only words that start with a certain letters, or include only words that have letter combinations that are in that week's spelling lesson.
