


















How To Have a Conversation

-  Look at the person you're talking to.
-  Smile and say 'hello'.
-  Listen to their response. Take turns talking.
-  Stay on topic. Talk about the same thing.
-  Ask a good question. Choose a friendly topic.
-  Avoid mean or sensitive topics.







Conversation Topics

-  School: What is your favorite subject?
-  Family: Do you have a big family?
-  Interests: Do you like music?
-  Interests: Do you like sports?
-  Interests: What TV shows do you watch?
-  Home: Where are you from?
-  Work: What kind of work do you do?
-  DON'T talk about weight.
-  DON'T talk about private things.








Interrupting a Conversation

-  Decide if you want to interrupt to ask for help or because you need something
-  Wait quietly for a pause in the conversation
-  Gesture with your hand, or move to get in their line of vision
-  When there is a pause or they look at you, say "Excuse me" and ask for what you want or need







Interrupting in Class

-  Decide if you want to interrupt because you need help or you want something
-  Raise your hand
-  Wait quietly to be called on
-  When the teacher calls on you say "Excuse me" and ask for what you want or need
-  Don't interrupt anymore if the teacher says to stop. Sometimes teachers want you to wait to ask your questions at the end of the lesson.



Interrupting at Work

-  Decide if you want to interrupt someone who is working to ask a question or because you need something
-  Quietly knock on their door, or get in their line of vision
-  Wait quietly for them to look at you, or to say "Come in"
-  Say "Excuse me" and tell them what you want to say

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



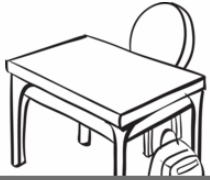
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
