



Why Dads Should Volunteer

- ☐  Research shows kids do better when dads are active participants in education.
- ☐  Teach kids that all parents, not just women, care about education.
- ☐  Diversity in volunteers reaches more kids.
- ☐  Dads will understand and help communicate when funding, votes, supplies, etc. are needed.
- ☐  Dads will gain a deeper connection with their kids by seeing them in the classroom and getting to know their teachers and peers.
- ☐  Teach kids that everyone, not just women, can do important work without getting paid.
- ☐  It doubles the volunteer pool!



Help Dads Volunteer

- ☐  Ask them!
- ☐  Hand out volunteer interest forms to all parents (never 1 per family)
- ☐  Avoid gendered language (Party Mom)
- ☐  Send all opportunities to all parents. Encourage parents to set up a joint email.
- ☐  At parent night, give a speech about how valuable it is for kids to see both moms and dads caring about education
- ☐  Point out that dads connect with kids differently than moms - and they connect with different kids
- ☐  Ask dads what kind of jobs fit best into their schedule (ask this of working moms too)



Tips for Dad Volunteers

Sign up for jobs that are first thing in the morning before work starts.

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Share a weekly volunteer slot with your wife to cut the time commitment in half.

☐


Volunteer over lunch or just eat lunch with the class once/month.

☐


Class photographer only needs to go in a handful of times/year.

☐


Be the party planner. There are only a few, and dad energy results in excellent party games.

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Go on a field trip.

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Volunteer at the library or for the school book sale.

Help at night - BBQ, science fair, game night.



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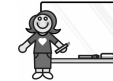

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
